

Junior Year Planning

- Review Graduation Plan at Indiana Career Explorer (Career plan, college and postsecondary plan, testing plan, and high school plan)
- Take college entrance exams:
 - Take the **NEW SAT Test** – www.sat.collegeboard.org
 - Take the **ACT with Writing Test** – www.actstudent.org
 - Recommend taking **twice** during junior year.
 - Fee waivers are available in the counseling office for qualified students.
 - Prep materials are available in the counseling office and online.
- Explore Indiana Career Explorer: <https://indiana.kuder.com/landing-page>
 - Take a career interest inventory, explore careers and colleges, and take a learning style assessment.
 - Add your high school activities, volunteer work, and work experience in your portfolio for future scholarships, college applications, and your résumé.
- Start researching scholarship opportunities (available on CCHS Counseling website, other scholarship search engine links, and specific college admission websites)
- Complete the College Cost Estimator (www.indianacollegecosts.org)
- Complete your Scholar Success activities if you are a 21st Century Scholar at www.Scholars.IN.gov/scholartrack. You must also earn a 2.5GPA and a Core 40 diploma.
- Get involved! Participate in clubs, sports, and volunteer activities.
- Register for initial eligibility with the NCAA Eligibility Center online www.eligibilitycenter.org.
- Set and achieve high expectations.
 - Obtain all of your credits.
 - Set a goal GPA appropriate for your future plans.

- Apply to colleges online by October 1.
- Re-take SAT and/or ACT in the fall to raise scores for admission and/or scholarships.
